## ALBERTA DIRECT TRADE

**Alberta direct trade** last week saw light trade develop with weighted average steer and heifer price closing the week around \$350.00/cwt, \$6.00/cwt lower than the previous week. This is really the first significant price pull back seen this year. Annual price highs could now be in our rearview mirror. Last week butcher cows traded steady to \$7.00/cwt higher through commercial auction facilities. Grass conditions remain good across much of the Prairies and there will be little to no panic to bring cows in early off summer pastures. This should keep non-fed supplies manageable for the next couple of months.

**The U.S. cash cattle trade** saw no new trade to report. Significant trade will likely be delayed until the second half of this week. Asking prices are poorly defined but are expected to start out in the low \$250.00's/cwt on a live basis. Beef cutout values had a tough day yesterday closing \$3.00-7.00/cwt lower. From a seasonal perspective weaker wholesale beef prices are not uncommon for this time of the year. With warmer temperatures and many folks on holidays/road trips, people are looking for lighter meals such as cold cuts and hot dogs. And are also doing less oven prepared meals.
