Alberta direct trade saw a strong trade this week with prices up \$5.00-\$8.00 cwt on average. Canfax reports that: "Dressed sales have been reported from \$268.00-\$273.00 delivered, \$5.00-\$8.00 higher than last week. All three western Canadian packers were showing interest on the cash market. Buyers were indicating cattle that they bought this week would be lifted in early May. With fed prices moving back to the low 160's, fed calves are being sold with a small profit margin."

U.S. cash cattle trade is seeing light to moderate trade develop with prices in the south up \$2.00 at \$124.00 live. Bids in the north are reported from \$197.00-\$198.00 dressed which is up \$5.00-\$6.00 from last week's weighted average prices and \$2.00 higher than late week trade last week. However feedlots in the north are holding out for higher prices with asking prices firmly sitting at \$200.00 dressed. Trade will continue into the late afternoon and possibly early evening.


In 2017, eastern federally inspected cattle slaughter was 653,000 head, up 6% from the prior year and up 3% from the five-year average. While up from the recent low in 2015, this is just over half of 1.2 million slaughtered annually in the 1970s and 1980s. Eastern slaughter has represented between 22-26% of the national total over the last ten years.


From January to mid-April 2018 total cattle slaughter is steady with last year. There is variation between classes with steer slaughter up 7%, heifers down 20%, cows steady and bulls up 27%. Stronger domestic demand for trim meant that cow slaughter shifted in 2017, with more cows staying in Canada for processing rather than being exported to the United States. So far, this trend has continued in 2018.


Eastern Canada has less seasonal variation in weekly slaughter than the national numbers, averaging around 13,000 head per week from November through March to 11,000 head per week in May through July. Over the next four weeks, supplies will seasonally tighten just as spring grilling season finally heats up, supporting prices.

Despite slaughter being steady, larger carcass weights year to date have meant that beef production is up 1% in eastern Canada. Ontario steer carcass weights have been up from last year but remain slightly below the record high levels set in the spring of 2016.

Ontario historically had the highest AAA and prime grading in Canada or the United States. But AAA and prime grading in eastern Canada has not kept up with the US and the west has caught up and surpassed eastern grading in recent years. Eastern Canadian AAA and prime grading dropped from a high of 66% in 2015 to 61% in 2016. This compares to western Canadian grading of 64% in 2015, 68.5% in 2016 and 69.7% YTD.







While grading performance has rebounded in 2017 to 64% and 67% YTD this is currently down slightly from last year's 69% during the same time period, despite slightly heavier steer carcass weights this spring. It should be noted that record high carcass weights in 2016 coincided with sharply lower grading performance. Grading is impacted by multiple factors including weather, feed, genetics, and management making it hard to determine why grading is lower in the region.

However, lower grading in the region is not a recent phenomenon but is the result of 15 years of slower grading gains in the region. The decline in grading performance from 2003 to 2006, took until 2011 to reverse and is still contributing to the current difference. - Brenna Grant
