ALBERTA DIRECT TRADE

Alberta direct trade on Wednesday saw a very light test with prices reported by Canfax as \$6.00 lower. Steers sold at \$153.75 live and \$263.00 delivered on a dressed basis, but only a few sales were reported. Canfax reported that "feedlots are not overly motivated sellers but there are a few large cattle that need to trade this week. Light follow up trade is anticipated for this afternoon but active trade may not develop this week."

U.S. TRADE (U.S. funds)

The U.S cash cattle trade * remains untested. Asking prices are holding firm at \$126.00-\$127.00 live in the south and \$200.00-\$203.00 dressed in the north with just a couple of bids in the south this today at \$121.00 live. At this point it appears that active trading is going to be delayed until Friday, again this week.

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Cow marketings

Cow marketings in Eastern Canada are projected to be up 13% in 2018 to 235,800 head (this includes federal, provincial and uninspected slaughter as well as live exports and CFIA tested animals). While up 30,000 head from the 2016 lows they are well within recent historic levels and remain below 2013 high of 260,000 head.

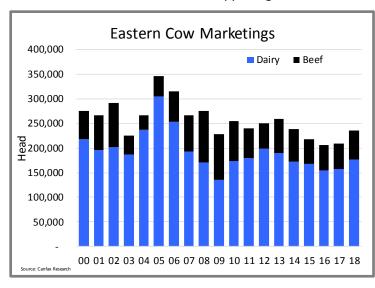
Domestic slaughter was up 15%, while live cow exports are projected to be up 11% based on through November data. January proportion of cows being processed in Eastern Canada declined substantially between the peak in 2006 (100%) and the low in 2015 (42%). Since there the trend has been for proportionately more cows to be processed in Canada with 64% in 2018.

Given that dairy cows are undesirable to be

transported long distances and most US packers are quite a distance it would make sense if local packers are prioritizing dairy cows over beef cows.

While Canada does not breakdown beef and dairy cows at slaughter, or in the live export data, it is possible to estimate beef and dairy cow marketings from national culling rates and inventories. While it is recognized that these are rough estimates (with the 2003-06 period over-estimating dairy numbers and under-estimating beef numbers), they do provide an indication or trend of what is happening in each sector.



Eastern beef cow marketings are estimated to be up 16% (8,000 head) to 59,500 head; while dairy cow marketings are projected to be up 12% (19,000 head) to 176,000 head. In the last 10 years the percentage of dairy cow has ranged widely between 59-79% of total eastern cow marketings – but for the last three years has been steady at 75%. Dairy cow marketings trended down from the mid-1980s until 2009 and have been relatively steady since.

Eastern Cow Marketings

Beef and dairy cow marketings as a percentage of January 1st inventories provide culling rates for the region of 13.7% and 24% respectively. These are consistent with the national averages and suggest that the eastern beef cow herd will be smaller on January 1, 2019. - Brenna Grant

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
