Today a light trade has developed in the south at \$126.00 live down \$2.00 from last week, while business in the north is selling from \$206.00-\$207.00 dressed, with majority at \$206.00, down \$2.00 from last week on average.

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
Cattle Inventories and Feeder Imports


Ontario cattle inventories were down 0.7% or 11,200 head on January 1, 2019 at 1.59 million head. The decline was driven by smaller dairy heifers (down 4,300 head), steers over one year old (down 3,800) and beef heifers for slaughter (down 2,000 head). Beef and dairy cows were both down half a percent representing 1,300 and 1,800 head respectively. Calves less than one year old were the only category that was up 0.9% or 3,600 head. This reflects the slight increase (6,600 head) in beef and dairy cows from 2017 to 2018, that calved last spring.

The total number of cows, both beef and dairy, have been generally declining in Eastern Canada since 1980. This is not surprising given the competition for land use and urban expansion. At 1.17 million head in 2019, beef and dairy cows in

the region are up 1.8% from the 2017 low and steady with 2018. Inventories in the region are being supported by the Quebec dairy industry which has expanded by 17,500 head





between 2017 and 2019.

From 1983 until 1997, eastern Canada represented around 17.5% of total beef cow inventories. This dropped in the late 1990s and early 2000s and over the last decade has been around 12%.

Of interest to feedlots, is the supply of feeder cattle (beef heifers for slaughter, steers and calves), which was down 2,200 head from last year. However, U.S. feeder imports more than make up from the decline in the local calf crop. In 2018, Canada imported 180,250 head of U.S. feeder cattle. Ontario and Quebec imported 19,550 head and 5,428 head respectively – accounting for 14% of the total. The imports into Quebec almost all came from Vermont. Imports into Ontario primarily came from New York (43%) followed by North Carolina (27%), Wisconsin (14%) and Virginia (9%). The remaining 7% came from other Great Lake and Northeast States.

Therefore, despite a smaller calf crop coming forward fed cattle markets in the region are expected to be up in 2019. Cow marketings this summer will be influenced by weather, both pasture conditions and production of winter feed, as well as margins in the dairy sector both north and south of the border.

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
