ALBERTA DIRECT TRADE

Alberta direct trade for last week saw fed cattle priced from \$183.00-\$190.50 live. On the rail, sales were priced at \$308.50 FOB. Delivery dates were reported from late January to early February. Canfax stated that: "In 2022 Western Canadian fed slaughter was 3,400 head larger than last year, while cow slaughter was 18,000 higher than last year. This is the largest fed slaughter volume seen since 2005, while cow slaughter volumes were the largest since 2019." This week, the market remains untested however packer interest could surface today.

U.S. TRADE (U.S. funds)

The U.S. cash cattle trade is very quiet with no trade reported for yesterday. Today, a few early asking prices have been noted in the south around \$158.00-\$159.00 live but there are no bids on the table. Active trade isn't expected to develop until Wednesday at the earliest.
