Comments for the week ending November 29, 2018

334 fed steers and heifers sold through auction markets this week, down 45 head from last week and 139 less than the same time last year. Fed steers sold from \$108.24-\$137.12 with a weekly weighted average price of \$126.99 down \$5.14 from last week and \$8.88 below year ago prices. Volumes of fed steers were much lighter this week with the quality affecting the pricing. Fed heifers sold from \$124.48-\$138.82 averaging \$133.12 up \$10.58 from last week and \$3.63 below last year at this time. Larger volumes of heifers and better quality were noted. Auction markets reported trade as steady to about steady, with demand selective in spots and one auction noting a few fancy kinds trading higher.

Ontario railgrade deals were light again this week at continued steady prices of \$244.00 for steers and \$243.00 dressed for heifers. Packer buying interest has been noted as limited to light with one packer picking up a few here and there. This week's average prices are steady to last week and \$6.50 above year ago prices, with delivery anywhere from next week through to the last week of December.

2,768 fed/cull cows sold through auction markets this week up 327 from last week and 344 more than last year at this time. Cows traded from \$34.31-\$52.44 with a weekly weighted average price of \$42.18 which is up \$2.07 from last week and the first time in nine weeks that the market has been stronger. This week's average prices are \$19.86 lower than last year at this time. Auction markets reported trade as about steady to steady, with one report of higher prices the first half of this reporting week. The second half of the week saw prices about steady to barely steady, on a selective demand but by Thursday the market was active at stronger prices.

Lighter receipts of 6,820 stocker and feeder cattle sold through auction markets this week, down 627 head from last week and 781 fewer than the same week last year. Auction markets reported calves as steady to fully steady on the good quality, with second cut and non-vaccinated calves selling under pressure. Heavier cattle were steady on the top quality with plainer types and medium quality under pressure. By mid-week, heavy feeder cattle were noted as trading actively at prices \$3.00-\$5.00 cwt stronger than last week. Actual average prices for the week in Ontario, saw steers 400-500 lbs up \$3.57 from last week on average, steers 500-600 lbs were down \$1.01, 600-700 lbs down \$8.02, 700-800 lbs down \$6.61, 800-900 lbs down \$2.13, 900-1000 lbs down \$5.01 and steers 1000 lbs and over were down \$0.64 from last week on average. Heifers from 300-400 lbs were up \$1.15 from last week's weighted average price, with heifers 400-500 lbs up \$4.01, 500-600 lbs were up \$4.09, 600-700 lbs down \$8.08, 700-800 lbs down \$9.10, 800-900 lbs up \$5.61 and heifers 900 lbs and over averaged \$1.66 stronger than last week, on average.

The Quebec electronic market this week ranged from \$233.00-\$236.25 dressed, down \$1.00 from last week on average.

Alberta direct trade this week was light with prices reported by Canfax as steady to \$1.00 cwt higher. Canfax notes prices from \$252.00-\$253.00 delivered on a dressed basis. Prices for cattle picked up were reported at \$150.00 live for steers and \$148.50 for heifers, averaging \$1.60 stronger on the steers. On the rail steers sold at \$251.50 up \$2.78 on average, while dressed heifers sold from \$250.50-\$251.50 picked up, averaging \$251.27 up \$2.47 from the week before. Canfax reports that "feedlot market ready supplies are trending more current and this week's offering saw an increased volume of weight sorted heifers on offer." Canfax also noted that a good portion of this week's show lists will be carried over to next week.

US cash cattle trade for the week ending November 23rd was stronger with the USDA Mandatory Price Report listing live sales for the week from \$110.00-\$117.00, with steers averaging \$115.39 up \$2.39 from the previous week while heifers averaged \$115.90 up \$2.60. On the rail steers and heifers traded from \$176.00-\$185.00, with steers averaging \$181.89 up \$4.51 from the previous week while heifers averaged \$182.24 up \$4.46.

This week, the U.S. cash market has been fairly quiet. On Wednesday at the Fed Cattle Exchange online auction there were 620 head on offer, in 7 lots with delivery in 1-9 days on two lots and 1-17 days on the remainder. Five lots were asking \$116.00, one lot \$116.50 and one lot \$117.00 live. One lot of steers asking \$116.00 live saw some active bidding and sold at \$116.75, while all other lots saw no bids and were left unsold. On the cash market, a few sales here and there were noted through the week from \$114.00-\$116.75 live and \$178.00-\$185.00 dressed which is steady to last week's ranges, but not enough have traded to establish any kind of market. At time of reporting, bids are sitting at \$112.00 live in the south and \$180.00-\$183.00 dressed in the north, but bids are not getting any cattle bought. Asking prices are holding firm at \$120.00 live in the south and \$187.00 plus dressed in the north. At this point trade could be delayed until late afternoon or even into the early evening.


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Who has the leverage?


From January to mid-November 2018 eastern cattle slaughter is up 4% from last year. Steer slaughter up 3%, heifers down 1%, cows up 16% and bulls down 23%. Ontario represents 94% of total eastern Canadian slaughter.


Utilization rates in eastern Canadian packing plants has historically been around 80%. That shifted with plant closures - Les Viandes Laroche in October 2015 and Les Viandes Valleyfield in March 2016. This put leverage in the hands of the packers with utilization rates increasing to 85% in 2016, 92% in 2017 and 95% year to date in 2018. Utilization is calculated based on a five-day week at plants and therefore any Saturday kills can increase utilization rates to 120% on a weekly basis. In



addition to reduced capacity, packers are biding to keep more fed cattle in Canada to be processed. Ontario fed cattle exports are down 13% from January through September. This has contributed to the larger slaughter volumes and improved utilization rates.

Despite aggressive slaughter volumes that would be expected to pull cattle forward, Ontario steer carcass weights have been steady with last year. Year to date weights have averaged 3 lbs more than 2017 and 22 lbs more than the five-year





average. However, since September weights have been 5 lbs lighter than last year. As long as demand remains to pull volume, lighter carcass weights have the potential to put some leverage back in the hands of the feedlots.

An indicator of leverage is the fed steer prices as a percentage of the AAA cutout value. If the rail price is equal to the value of the boxed beef and by-product revenue pays for the kill and fabrication costs; breakeven for a packer would be around 100% - recognizing that these are rough figures as the AAA cutout value is a Canadian average and therefore weighted towards Western Canada.

Between June 2010 and November 2015, the Ontario rail price was 100-112% of the AAA cutout value, indicating that Ontario feedlots had leverage when negotiating with local packers. However, since the fall of 2015 this has gone back to the historic range of 88-100% indicating that the leverage is back in the hands of the packer. So far this fall, the ratio has been steady to slightly stronger than last year.

Packers gained leverage on retailers from 2010 through 2015 (see AAA cutout as percentage of the retail beef price). That explains why they were willing to pay more for fed cattle during that time period. Since 2015 leverage has been steady to softer, as beef supplies have increased and demand has been stable. Eastern packers will continue running full out as long as they remain profitable. - Brenna Grant

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
