Comments for the week ending January 13th

There were 346 fed steers and heifers sold through auction markets this week, up 27 from last week and 27 fewer than the same week last year. Fed steers ranged from \$160.24-\$176.83 averaging \$169.20 down \$2.17 from last week on average but \$39.22 above year ago prices. Fed heifers sold from \$153.60-\$169.79 averaging \$162.83 down \$6.92 from last week but \$33.35 stronger than last year at this time. Auction markets reported trade as active at fully steady to slightly lower prices on a good quality offering early week. By mid week prices were noted as \$3.00-\$4.00 cwt higher on light receipts and ended the week \$3.00-\$4.00 cwt lower.

The Ontario railgrade market was light with sales reported throughout the week. Steers were reported at \$290.00 dressed with heifers from \$288.00-\$293.00, mainly \$290.00. One federal packer was not buying this week. Prices are mainly steady to last week with delivery reported for next week. This week's average is \$54.00 stronger than last year at this time.

The Boxed Beef Report by Kevin Grier reports on Spot Market Canadian Product Availability: "Cargill in High River has been hit hard by COVID-related labor problems both last week and this week. The situation is tenuous in Guelph also. JBS appeared to be in good shape last week and this week so far. Canadian product availability will obviously be much tighter as a result. The Chinese and Korean bans on Canadian product are not likely to have any impact on availability; more will go to U.S."

There were 2,865 fed/cull cows sold through Ontario auction markets this week, up 281 from last week but 815 fewer than the same time last year. Cows sold from \$54.12-\$80.67 averaging \$65.89 up \$0.29 from last week and \$15.03 stronger than year ago prices. Auction markets reported prices as steady to fully steady and a few noting prices slightly stronger.

Larger receipts of 2,948 stocker and feeder cattle were sold at auction markets this week, up 1,776 head from last week and fully steady to this time last year. Auction markets reported active trading on strong demand. Calves were steady to strong while yearling were up \$5.00-\$8.00 to start, \$3.00-\$5.00 cwt higher by mid-week and easier than last week's high trade as the week progressed. All classes finished the week out holding steady. Actual average prices this week saw steers 400-500 lbs up \$9.63 from last week on average, 500-600 lbs up \$0.59, 600-700 lbs up \$7.65, 700-800 lbs up \$4.93, 800-900 lbs up \$14.28, 900-1000 lbs down \$9.77 and steers 1000 lbs plus averaged \$1.19 stronger than last week. Heifers from 300-400 lbs were up \$6.37 from last week, 400-500 lbs down \$11.44, 500-600 lbs down \$0.32, 600-700 lbs up \$7.28, 700-800 lbs up \$12.36, 800-900 lbs up \$22.18 (noting extremely light volumes last week) and heifers 900 lbs and over averaged \$0.59 below last week's weighted average prices. Most weight categories are trading well above last year at this time.

The Quebec electronic market this week ranged from \$290.75-\$293.50 dressed on a picked-up basis, up \$0.75 from the previous week's average prices.

Alberta direct trade was under pressure again this week with Canfax noting dressed sales from \$260.00-\$261.00 delivered, down \$10.00-\$11.00 cwt from last week. On a picked-up basis trade was reported by Canfax at \$154.50 live and \$258.50-\$260.50 dressed. Canfax reports: "The few cattle that traded this week would not be picked up until the middle of February. Alberta fed basis levels continue to weaken, for the first half of January this is the weakest cash to futures basis levels have been since 2009."

The U.S. cash cattle trade for the week ending January 7th saw the bulk of trade on Wednesday with just some clean up deals the remainder of the week. Business in the south was from \$136.00-\$138.00 live, mainly \$138.00 which is about steady to the previous week. Deals in the north were steady to slightly lower at \$138.00-\$140.00 live and \$218.00-\$220.00 dressed. Overall weighted average prices for the week, reported by the USDA Mandatory Price Report, saw live steers average \$138.41 down \$1.18 with heifers \$138.09 down \$0.97. On the rail steers averaged \$219.98 down \$0.91 with heifers averaging \$219.99 down \$1.32.

This week the US cash market has been light at easier prices. Deals on Tuesday were light in the south with trade from \$135.00-\$137.00 live which is steady to the bottom of last week's trade and \$1.00-\$2.00 easier than last week's average. In the north a couple of deals were noted at \$137.00 live, also lower than last week. On Wednesday business in the north was reported from \$137.00-\$138.00 live and \$218.00 dressed down around \$2.00 cwt from last week's sales. In the south trade was mixed, from \$135.00-\$137.00 in Kansas and \$137.00 in Texas, also down \$2.00 from last week's prices. A light scattered trade on Thursday was steady to the week's decline and it appears the bulk of trade for the week is completed. Monday is a holiday in the U.S. so packers were purchasing for a shortened week along with reduced processing due to Covid-19 related staffing issues.
